CHANGES ... Covid and the Mechanics

I retired from my teaching job in March 2020. I'd been putting it off as I loved teaching lipreading to deaf adults but it seemed the obvious moment to go. With lockdown, who knew when we'd be back to normal? The Mechanics, too, made changes during Covid – some small, some large - and all designed to improve it.

In August 2020 we appointed a new manager and Adam arrived. With a rush of enthusiasm and the help of staff and volunteers the restaurant was re-painted, re-arranged, and busts of Dickens and Lawrence were brought out to watch over those who ate and drank there. New menus and drinks were introduced. The Library was transformed, with older books donated to the British Heart Foundation. This created areas where small groups such as embroiderers and readers could gather together in a comfortable space. The attic is now being cleared by our recently appointed Chairman, Geoff Freeman, and will soon be available for groups to hire for storage.

Staff and management changed as well. Sadly, some have left us

forever. Others retired or found different jobs, leaving a smaller work force to adapt to new roles, working in the kitchen and in reception etc. We discovered that our workers had a range of hidden talents, including Kyle who designed our new brochures (right), which we are hoping will be distributed by our members to shops and libraries around where they live.



Finally, Management decided to sell Birkbeck House, a property we owned outside

the City which was empty and was damaging our finances. With this sale, and the recent changes, there is hope for a brighter future for the Mechanics. Covid gave us the time to do much of this.
